The Association Annual General Meeting was held on **Sun 3rd Dec** at **Sargood Barracks**. MAJ Garry Rolfe highlighted all the work done on the memorabilia room over 2023. It's in a much better state than this time last year. The work on it continues.



CAPT Stepnell gave the Bty address on behalf of the BC who had been called away at short notice. He provided an update on 9 Regt drone training and capability. 9 Regt is also now tasked to develop radar capabilities which will see the introduction of new equipment and training requirements into the Regt. Given the in-service done capability is limited, it is acknowledged that with the current tempo of activity there are significant demands on PT personnel to support FT training activities.

LTCOL Rowley gave an update on the Victorian gunner history work. The RAA Association to provide material for the Victorian annex of RAAHC Essential History of Artillery publication. Association will continue to call for material from members via Facebook building upon the momentum achieved over 2022/2023 with member submissions. Timeframe is from the formation of the GRES as the replacement for the Militia in the 1970's through to the disbandment of 2/10 Fd Regt. Submission of members memories and anecdotal stories from this period are encouraged.
