This augments the accredited publication being launch on the 1 Aug 24 in Canberra by the RAAHC Action! Action! Action! A Short History of the Employment of Australian Artillery 1871-2021. I have seen a draft copy and strongly recommend it to your key reference books on Australian Artillery. As the title sys it is a short history and is the first on many publications planned for the future.

The new look Armoured Museum or Combined Arms Museum is progressing quickly and are actively looking for volunteers to assist the dedicated crew already restoring items for display. HISTORY OF ARTILLERY IN VICTORIA

Much information is already available on the older history, and there's significant content in Jim Killinder's book "The gunners of Victoria, 1948 to 2000" that needs to be reviewed and added to with the recent history of the reserve Artillery, particularly in the wake of Plan Beersheba. A Few Words on Internet Security

We have had some members reach out saying they have been hacked. We thought it wise to share information regarding the security of your details, communications and some things you can do to keep yourself safe online.

As you would expect, the Association keeps a copy of your details in a database, including names, email addresses, service information etc. This database is password-protected, and the password is known only to the committee members. It is not accessible via the website. We don't believe it has been compromised - if it had there would be a lot more members reporting issues.

Similarly, the Association does not publish members' email addresses or phone numbers on our Facebook page or website. We only publish the generic email addresses (such as "president@artilleryvic.org.au"). Whilst we sometimes mention people by name, we are always happy to remove or redact names if a member raises it as an issue.

There are a lot of dodgy people out there trying different ways to hack into people's accounts or con them out of money. The most common are emails and phone calls. The only person you should hear from over the phone regarding any financial matters is Paul Heron (Treasurer and Membership Secretary) and he will only contact you regarding small amounts (such as membership fees). If anyone else rings you and pretends to be from the association or the committee asking for money, this is a red flag, and you should hang up (or contact the authorities).

The association will contact you electronically via emails (and you can also consume information via the facebook page or website as you choose). We do not text members.

As is good practice, be wary of any email with links as they may be trying to take you to suspect websites and/or download malicious software onto your computer. We will only ever link to the Association websitehttps://artilleryvic.org.au. If an email that looks like it came from us has website links different to that, that is a red flag, and you should ignore the email (and possibly mark it as spam). You should never click on a link if you don't trust it (often you can hover your mouse over a link to see the actual address it is using). These practices aren't just for Association communications, it's good security practice.
