To get you started, let me inform you about a national event that occurred earlier this month, some amazing work occurring at the Army Museum Puckapunyal and a couple of social events occurring in Melbourne shortly.

Last Newsletter I spoke about the national launch of Action! Action! Action! A Short History of the Employment of Australian Artillery 1871-2021 commissioned by the Royal Australian Artillery Historical Company. It was an excellent event held at RMC House, Canberra with the Chief of Army officially launching the book and speaking of the importance of our significant contribution to the defence of our country over our 150 years highlighting our rich history, and our contribution today and into the future.

The event was combined with the traditional Tie Presentation where the Regiment present a gunner tie to our newly minted officers joining our ranks. It was a wonderful opportunity for them to hear the Chief speak but also for us old gunners to hear about their exciting careers awaiting them.

But where can I get my copy – I hear you scream. If you use the following link: RAAHC (artilleryhistory.org) you can purchase your book online which I encourage every gunner that has served to do so (more details later in this newsletter). It is a well-crafted and referenced book, easy to read and covers our full history albeit briefly. The Assoc wish to augment this publication with all the photos and stories we already have on file – but more about this later.

The Army Museum Puckapunyal is extremely busy with readying our Artillery pieces for the opening which is now unfortunately pushed back until in early 2025. The Assoc is planning on attending in numbers so will send out the details once they firm up. WO2 David Mills, ex BSM 22 Bty, is our "manon-the-ground" as he is heavily involved in the restoration of our history as a volunteer at the museum.

If you don't have our Facebook page as one of your favourites, then you are doing yourself an injustice as Dave is regularly updating our sites with pictures and updates on their progress. He is providing some excellent photos of the artillery equipment being restored ready for display. He is actively looking for volunteers and has approval for up to 4-5 enthusiastic people to assist him. The Assoc was asked to support an amazing initiative presented to us by the 2/10 Bty Representative SGT Tim De La Zilwa known as Brothers' & Books. It is a national initiative founded in 2020 during COVID tackling the stigma of reading whilst improving our mental health Brothers and Books - Australia's leading Bibliotherapy Charity (brothersnbooks.com). Check out the website and sign up as a member. The Bty has established a library where defence members and their families can pop in take a book and read it or drop off a book they have finished reading or simply have a coffee and catch up with mates.

The Association donated a book from the Memorabilia room and Tim provided the bookcases and books from his own collection. This is a fantastic initiative well supported by the Bty and members of the association.



Many years ago, as a subaltern I recall thinking 'if only there was one single source of truth for the story of the Royal Australian Artillery' so we could piece together the history of the Regiment in Australia's many operational conflicts and tasks, and to also understand why some equipment were used, and how those capabilities fitted into the wider Army and joint efforts in Defence.

Now we have this outstanding new book to answer those questions. I have been lucky enough to observe the great progress of this vital book and earnestly congratulate all involved for the hard work and diligence to deliver this superb product. The task of simplifying the massive amounts of data and personal stories from over a century and a half of Gunner service to the nation is no mean feat.

The outcome is a highly readable and well-planned history of The Royal Regiment, and a huge vote of thanks must go to our authors and planning team – no doubt this book will have pride of place on the bookshelves of all Gunners.

WO2 David Mills, who many members will know, works at the museum and has been sharing photos on the Association Facebook page on arty items they are preparing. A short article with more photos is here.




WEBSITE UPDATES
